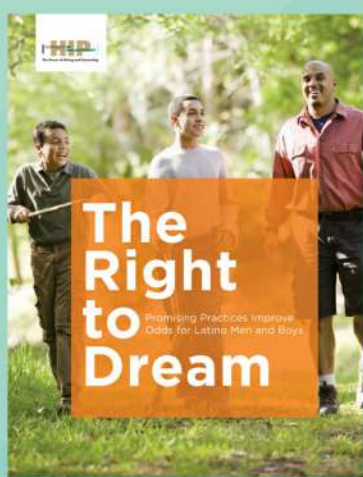

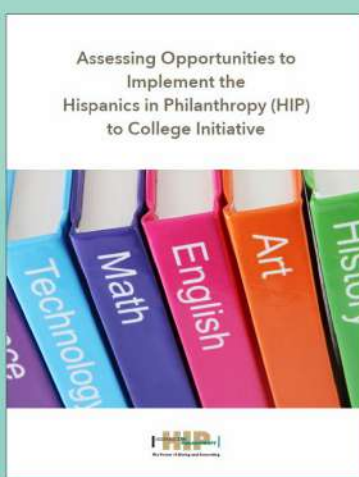

**PROGRAM HIGHLIGHT: HIP TO COLLEGE**  
Colorado and North Carolina

10 nonprofits were supported to help Latino youth graduate from high school and succeed in college.

**PROGRAM HIGHLIGHT: NORTH CAROLINA TRIANGLE FOR LATINO STUDENT SUCCESS (TLSS)**  
Durham County, North Carolina

400% INCREASED number of students in early college enrollment

300% INCREASED number of seniors admitted to higher education!

TLSS served 890 students and 70 parents.

**PROGRAM HIGHLIGHT: LATINO MEN AND BOYS**  
Arizona and New Mexico

HIP published a briefing on Latino Men and Boys and received its first major grant from Public Interest Projects and the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation to begin supporting organizations working in the Southwest to improve education, health and employment outcomes for Latino males.

HIP has mapped and identified 28 Mexican nonprofits that defend women's labor rights throughout the country.

Starting in 2015, HIP will work closely with 10 of these nonprofits offering a program of capacity building to strengthen their communication and advocacy strategies.

SERVING THE IMMEDIATE NEED: UNACCOMPANIED MINORS



Through the Fund for Unaccompanied Children, HIP and its partners have been able to distribute \$1.45 million in grants to high-impact nonprofit organizations providing the legal, social, and humanitarian services that these children so desperately need.
